WHAT TO EXPECT

Is it Mallorca or Majorca? In Spain, the island is typically referred to as "Mallorca," while in English and other languages, both "Mallorca" and "Majorca" are commonly used.

Language: España / Spanish

Currency: Euro (EUR)

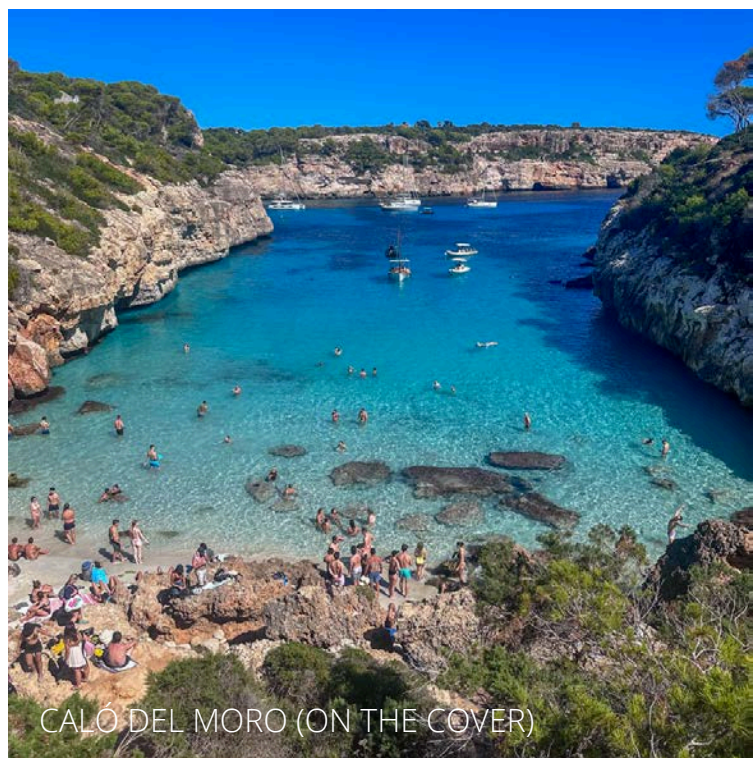
Credit Cards & ATMs: Many Mallorca shops, restaurants, and hotels accept credit cards, but not all. Definitely carry a little bit of cash on you.

Cell Service: If you don't have an international cell phone plan, pick up a SIM card at the airport or [purchase an eSIM here](#).

Plugs: The plugs in Mallorca are type F, the standard voltage is 230 V, and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. I recommend buying a [universal adapter](#) and using a [voltage converter](#) for hairdryers and beard trimmers.

Food and Drinks: The gastronomy of Mallorca, Spain, is a delightful blend of Mediterranean flavors, fresh local ingredients, and traditional recipes passed down through generations. From succulent seafood dishes like paella and arroz brut to hearty meat dishes such as lechona and frito mallorquín, Mallorcan cuisine offers a rich tapestry of flavors.

The Arts: Mallorca thrives in traditional crafts, contemporary galleries, and renowned artists inspired by the island's beauty.



CULTURE & CUSTOMS

Mallorca, a part of the Balearic Islands off the coast of Spain is deeply rooted in its rich history, diverse influences, and strong sense of community. Mallorcans are known for their warm hospitality and strong family ties, often gathering for lively celebrations and traditional festivals throughout the year, such as the ***Sant Antoni*** and ***Sant Sebastià*** festivals.

The island's cuisine reflects its Mediterranean heritage, with a focus on fresh seafood, olive oil, and locally sourced ingredients, while its traditional crafts, including pottery, basket weaving, and embroidery, showcase Mallorca's artisanal heritage. Some tips for paying for a meal: Get yourself a credit card with no international fees and use that as much as possible ([My favorite Travel Credit Cards](#)). AMEX and Discover are not accepted outside of hotels and large establishments. Bring a VISA/MasterCard .

Before you sit down at a restaurant, ask if they accept credit card. It's important to always carry a little cash with you, as some small restaurants and stores will not accept credit cards at all.

When the waiter runs your credit card, they will hand it back to you and you will get the option to pay in Euros or your home currency. ALWAYS select Euros to get the best exchange rate (your credit card company gives you a better exchange rate than machine.)

Tips are not included and usually there isn't a way to add it (you can ask for them to add it before you insert card). If you want to leave a tip, leave it as cash on the table. A typical tip depends on type of restaurant but can be loose change at a cafe or up to 10% at a nice restaurant.

Just remember, unlike in USA/Canada, they will never bring you the bill until you ask for it.

SAFETY & HOW TO AVOID PICKPOCKETS

Mallorca, Spain, is generally considered a safe destination for travelers. The island has a low crime rate, and violent crime is rare. However, like any tourist destination, visitors should still take common-sense precautions to ensure their safety:

1. **Stay Aware:** Be aware of your surroundings, especially in crowded tourist areas, and keep an eye on your belongings to prevent theft.
2. **Use Reliable Transportation:** If using public transportation or taxis, make sure to use licensed services and avoid unofficial taxis.
3. **Stay Hydrated:** During the hot summer months, stay hydrated and protect yourself from the sun to avoid heat-related issues.
4. **Be Cautious at Night in Palma:** While crime rates are low, it's still advisable to exercise caution when walking alone at night and stick to well-lit areas.
5. **Emergency Services:** Familiarize yourself with emergency contact numbers, including local police (112) and medical services, in case of any emergencies.
6. **Natural Hazards:** When visiting beaches or engaging in outdoor activities, be mindful of natural hazards such as strong currents or rough seas.

Overall, by taking basic safety precautions and using common sense, visitors can enjoy a safe and pleasant experience in Mallorca.

HOW TO AVOID PICKPOCKETS IN MALLORCA

1. Keep your bags in front of you
2. Put your wallet and phone in your front pockets
3. Try to fit in like a local by dressing like a local
4. Don't party too hard and open yourself up to confrontation and theft
5. Keep your cash hidden ([The best anti-theft bags](#))

PICKPOCKET VICTIM?

Report the theft as soon as you can to the police – pickpockets happen all the time, in fact, hundreds of times a day. Police are well aware of this issue. Reporting the theft also lets you claim it on insurance if your belongings cannot be found. However, this will take away some valuable sight-seeing time out of your day.

Cancel your credit cards and phone immediately. Ask to borrow a phone to call your credit card company.

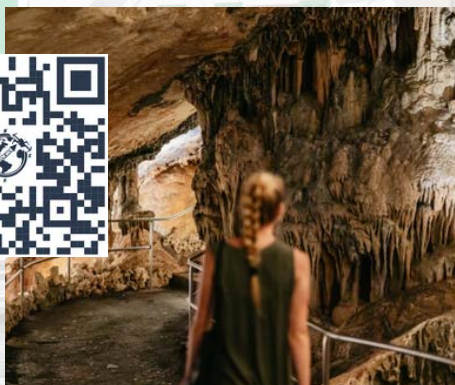

HOW TO SAVE MONEY IN MALLORCA

Try Shoulder Season. Flights are often cheaper in the shoulder- or offseason. Peak months are May - August. Jump on a great deal over at [CheapFlights.com](https://www.cheapflights.com)!

Avoid holidays, festivals, and other large events, unless that's the reason you're going to Mallorca! Just be aware events can inflate accommodation rates, overwhelm popular sights, and make it difficult—and costly—to get around.

Compare midweek to weekend prices. Accommodations in Mallorca tend to be more affordable on the weekdays but not always.



Use Travel Points. The [Capital One Venture One](https://www.capitalone.com) card is a fantastic travel rewards credit card with NO fee. However, you need good to excellent credit. If you're really serious about getting into travel reward points, consider using the [Chase Sapphire Preferred](https://www.chase.com) card.

Take the bus or metro. The island has an extensive bus network operated by the Empresa Municipal de Transportes (EMT) and other private companies. Buses connect major towns and resorts, as well as remote villages, making it a convenient and affordable way to explore Mallorca

Use [DiscoverCars.com](https://www.discovercars.com) to search, save and compare -up to 70% off, of your favorite rental companies like Enterprise, Hertz, AVIS, Budget & many more.

Hungry? You can find a really cheap meal or a nice snack (*see the croquettes in the picture below!*) at the local markets around the island. Otherwise, restaurants that are offering “menu del dia” (aka menu of the day) are great for penny pinchers.



Bring a water bottle. The tap water in Mallorca is fine to drink but buy a reusable filtered water bottle before your trip to save money (restaurants will charge you for bottled water) and reduce your plastic use. [LifeStraw](https://www.lifestraw.com) is my go-to brand as their bottles have built-in filters to ensure your water is always clean and safe.

Traveler Tip: Restaurant tipping- If you see "service included", it means that the tip has already been included. It is only a 10% tip so you can add more for great service.

MEDITERRANEAN CUISINE!

The food and gastronomy of Mallorca, Spain, are deeply rooted in the island's rich history, diverse cultural influences, and bountiful Mediterranean bounty. It's important to check flight prices as soon as you decide you're going to Mallorca. **PMI (Palma de Mallorca Airport)** is the airport on Palma de Mallorca. Use [CheapFlights.com](https://www.cheapflights.com) to search, compare and track flights.

Track multiple flight options with just a click of a few buttons.

A question I get often is, “**when should I book?**”. There's not a science to booking the right flight, at the right time. However, there are patterns to be aware of.

For example, flights May - August will always be higher, this is peak travel season. USA Holidays will also be higher. Popular festival dates will be higher. Religious holidays will be higher.

Shoulder season is the cheapest time to book (April, September, October). My favorite month to travel to Mallorca is September! Much of the summer crowds have gone away and the weather is still warm, but not too hot.

Generally, you should book your international flights around 120+ days out. Domestic flights should be booked 45 - 60 days out.



BOOKING YOUR ACCOMODATION

Once your flight is booked, you should book your accommodation(s) next.

Familiarize yourself with my sample itineraries provided at the back of this guide before finalizing your accommodations. The last thing you want is to book a place that's located far from the attractions that you plan to visit.

If you're visiting Mallorca for 4+ days, you might consider staying in two different neighborhoods.

The most popular areas to stay in are: Deià in the Northwest and Cala d'Or in the Southeast. A third option is the family-friendly area of Alcudia.

Before booking your accommodation, make sure you know the cancellation policy. And if you think you need it, purchase trip cancellation insurance. My favorite travel credit cards include trip protection, such as the [Capital One Venture](#) card or the [Chase Sapphire Preferred](#) card.



Another reason to book using your [Capital One Venture](#) or [Chase Sapphire Preferred](#) card is collecting miles and points for future traveling. **That's right, more benefits for you!** Every time I travel, I'm already checking my new mileage chart for my next destination.

So, use those travel reward credit cards to get a jump start on your future travels. You may even get a round trip to Mallorca for free by just using your sign-up bonus miles. I did!

TravelerTip: The great hotels and Airbnbs book up fast. Make sure to reserve your room at least four months in advanced.

Generally, hotel rooms don't give discounts but from time to time, I post 10% booking.com coupon codes on my facebook page, [HERE](#).

Reading reviews online of other travelers is a great idea before booking.

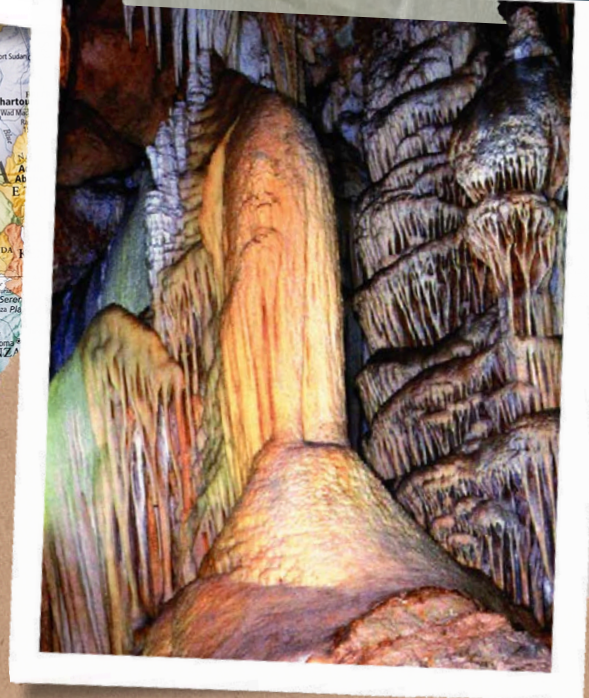
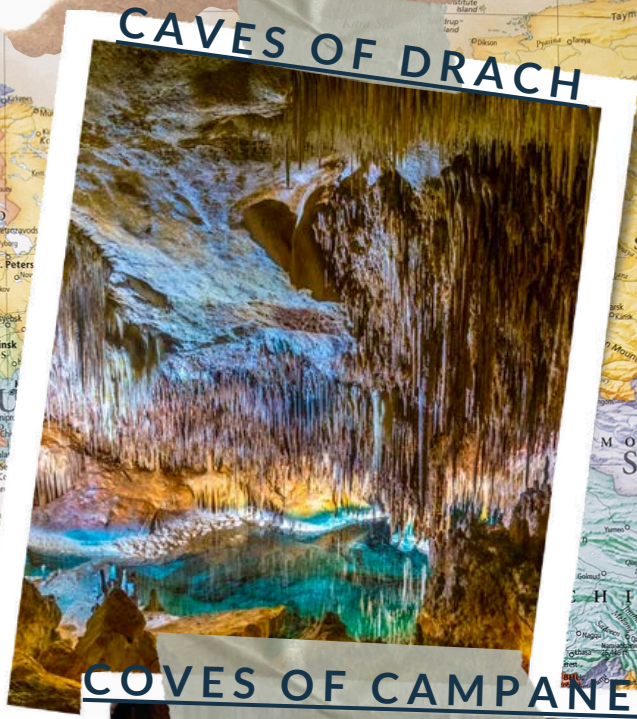

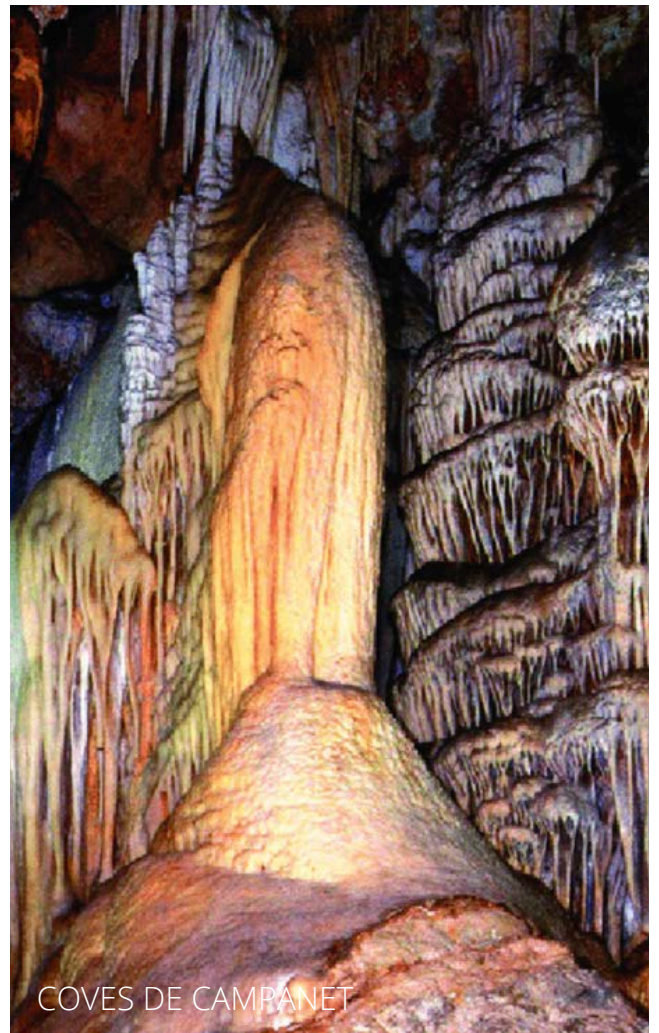

MALLORCA AIRPORT PICKUP

Often, the first question I get about Mallorca is, “How do I get to the city center?”



The easiest and **best option to get to your hotel or the city center** of Mallorca is to hire a private driver. This is because, the second you step out of baggage claim, you have somebody waiting for you with your name on a sign. [Hire a private driver here.](#)

The last thing you want to do after your long journey is to wait around for a bus, train, or a taxi driver.

The **cheapest way to get to the city center** is via the EMT bus. Single Ticket: €5.00+ depending on your destination.



The EMT Palma bus service operates routes connecting Palma Airport to various destinations across the island, including Palma city center and popular tourist areas like Magaluf and Palma Nova. Travelers can purchase tickets directly from the driver upon boarding.

Traveler Tip: Shared shuttle services offer a cost-effective way to reach popular tourist destinations from the airport. These services operate on a shared basis, meaning travelers may have to wait for other passengers before departing. Companies like Shuttle Direct and Resort Hoppa provide door-to-door transfers to major resorts and towns across Mallorca at competitive rates.

In addition to buses, Palma's public transportation network includes the metro and train services, providing alternative options for budget travelers. The metro connects the airport to Palma city center, while the train offers connections to other parts of the island, such as Inca and Manacor. Both options are affordable and convenient for exploring Mallorca on a budget.

Metro

The Metro line does not currently go to the airport and there is no Metro connection from Palma Airport to Palma city. To get to the Metro station from the airport, you will need to take a bus or a taxi.

Palma's Metro network is the smallest in Spain. Although it offers limited opportunities for getting around Palma city, it is a good option for reaching Palma's northern districts. The Metro is operated by Serveis Ferroviaris de Mallorca (SFM).

The closest metro station to Palma Airport is the Intermodal Station at Placa d'Espanya in Palma city. This is Palma's main station – trains, buses and coaches also depart from here.

Rideshare

Uber, Lyft, Ola & Didi are available from Palma De Mallorca Airport (PMI).

TRAINS & TRAMS

There is currently no train or [Metro link](#) to Palma Airport. In order to get to the train station, you will need to take a [bus](#) or a [taxi](#) from Palma Airport to Palma city.

Mallorca has a small rail network, T1, T2 and T3, none of which go all the way to any of the coastal resorts. The modern mainline train system extends from **Palma** via **Inca** to **Sa Pobla** and **Manacor**. A two-line Metro system serves Palma city and surroundings.

Palma Intermodal Train Station

The Palma Intermodal Station is the main train station for Palma de Mallorca and is found underground at Plaça d'Espanya. The main Metro and bus station are also situated here.

Palma to Inca – Train Line T1

The train journey from Palma Intermodal Station to Inca takes around half an hour. Trains to Inca run frequently – depending on the time of day there are between four and six trains per hour.

Palma to Sa Pobla – Train Line T2

The train journey from Palma Intermodal Station to Sa Pobla takes just over 50 minutes. Depending on the time of day, there is a train every 40 minutes to hourly.

Palma to Manacor – Train Line T3

The train journey from Palma Intermodal Station to Manacor takes 1 hour and 5 minutes. Depending on the time of day, there is a train every 40 minutes to hourly.

Aboveground and alongside the underground train station is the vintage train for Soller. Keep reading for more information on this, it's super neat and nostalgic!

Vintage Train

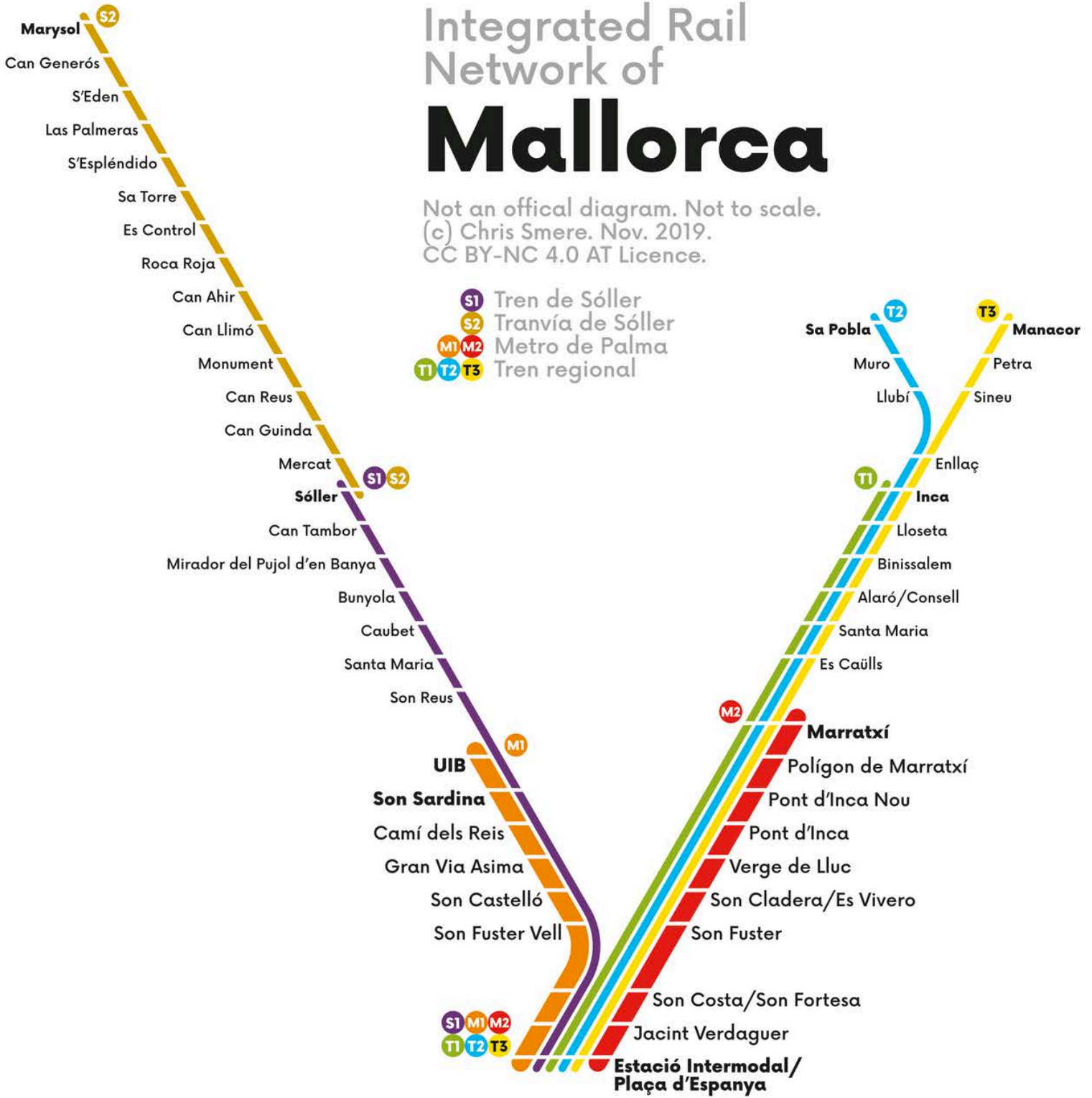
The Palma to Soller train is a true vintage narrow gauge train. It is also known affectionately as the wooden train due to its wooden carriages or as the “**Orange Express**”. This railroad is over one hundred years old and has been in service since 1912. While this option is not necessarily the fastest way of getting from Palma to Soller, a journey on this beautiful train along the extremely scenic route is an unforgettable experience for most. Including a 5 to 10-minute stop at the halfway point at Bunyola station, the journey time is around 1 hour.

Tren de Soller – timetables and tickets

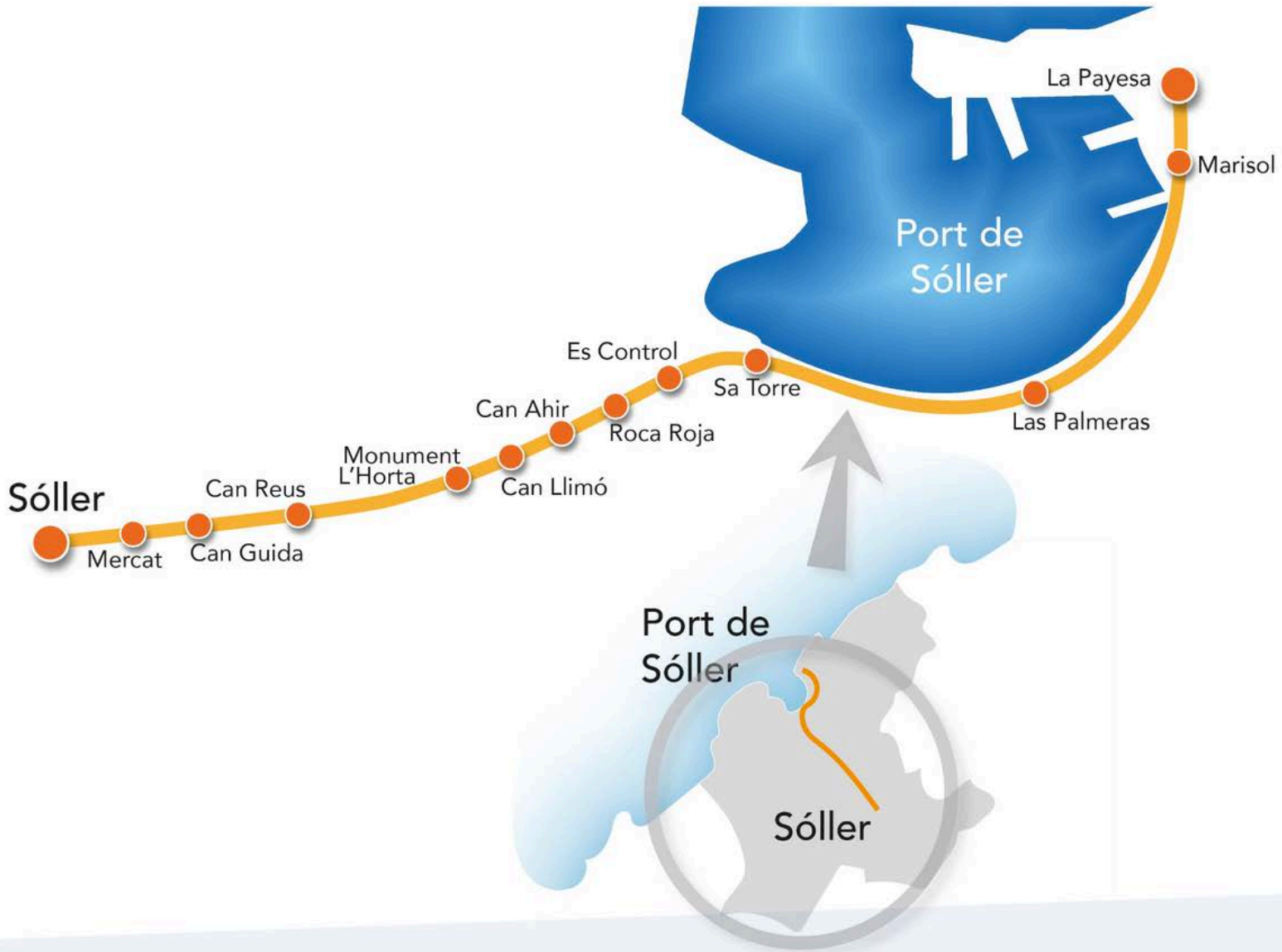
Tickets from Palma to Soller cost €20 one way and €28 for a return journey back to Palma. Tickets can be purchased at the station on the day of the journey. A combined train and tram return ticket can be purchased in advance via the Tren de Soller website (see below) for €35 or at the station, for the same price.

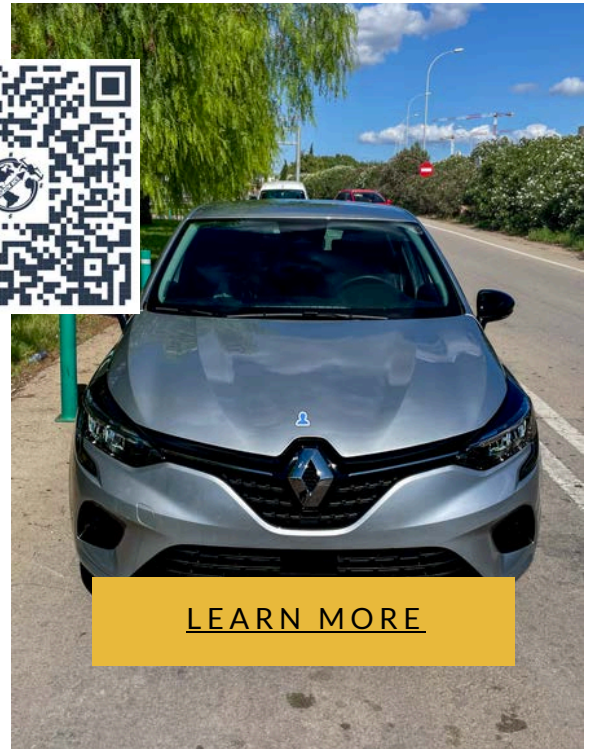

Pick up your car directly from the **Mallorca (PMI) Airport** and off you go!

There is just one toll road in Mallorca, the tunnel that runs in the direction of Soller, the Ma-11. The tunnel offers a shorter route compared to the old road, the Ma-11A, and is free of charge.

The most popular rental car in Spain is the Ford Fiesta, but travelers tend to also choose the Fiat 500 and the Ford Focus a lot.

If you plan to rent a car in Spain, it's recommended that you get an International Driving Permit in advance of your trip. These are issued through agencies like [AAA](#) (US), [CAA](#) (Canada), the [UK post office](#), and [AAA Australia](#). Cost varies by country from about \$5 to \$25, and IDPs are valid for one year. Spanish law requires foreign drivers to carry an IDP in addition to a driver's license.

ISLAND HOPPING

Mallorca, is surrounded by several smaller islands that offer unique experiences and attractions. The most notable islands near Mallorca include:

1. **Menorca:** Located to the northeast of Mallorca, Menorca is known for its pristine beaches, secluded coves, and tranquil atmosphere. Visitors can explore its charming towns, archaeological sites, and natural parks. To reach Menorca from Mallorca, travelers can take a ferry from Palma or Alcúdia, with crossings typically taking around 2-3 hours depending on the departure point and ferry operator.

GATHER DOCUMENTATION

At least six months before your departure, make sure your ID and other necessary documents are in order.

Driver's license: Most of the time, you can leave this at home. However, if you are renting a car, you will need to show it to your agency. Also, if you lose your passport, this is a good second form of identification.

Passport: Applying for or renewing a passport typically takes six to eight weeks, sometimes longer. However, you can pay an additional \$60 expedited service fee to get it renewed in two to three weeks, if desired. If you plan to travel outside the U.S., you need a passport. Make sure your passport will not expire for at least six months after your trip is scheduled to end. Some countries also require passports to have one to two blank pages for entry.

Visas: If you're traveling to another country, you may need to apply for a tourist visa. This could require paying a visit, or sending your passport, to a foreign embassy or consulate in the U.S. Application fees typically run from \$50 to \$200. Visit the U.S. Bureau of Consular Affairs to learn more.

TSA PreCheck and Global Entry: Travel Credit Reward Cards like the Chase Sapphire Preferred or Capital One card, give you up to a \$100 credit towards these programs.

Confused about the two programs? Here's the difference: **TSA Precheck** (\$85) puts you in a faster security line at U.S. airports.

Global Entry (\$100) includes TSA Precheck and adds expedited customs screening upon your return from international trips. These programs can help you zip through airport security lines.

Before you apply, give yourself a few weeks to fill out the online application and visit an enrollment center for fingerprinting and an ID check.

You must already have a valid U.S. passport to apply for Global Entry, and you must participate in an interview at a designated enrollment center. Once approved, your status lasts five years. Most interviews last about five minutes, it's very easy!

HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF 4 DAYS IN MALLORCA

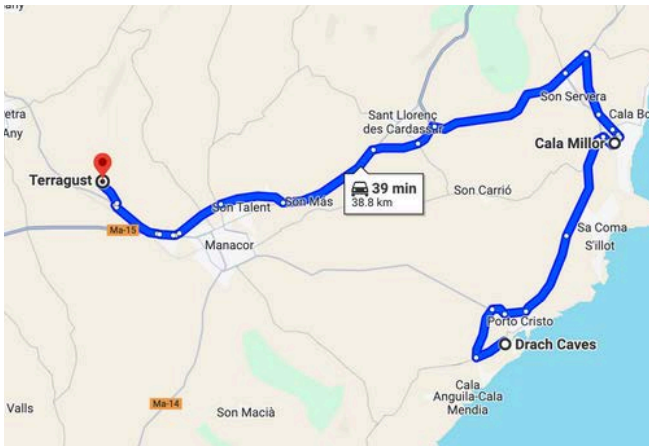
Day 1 - Start your day with a visit to Palma de Mallorca, the island's capital. Explore the historic Old Town, wandering through its narrow streets, admiring the Gothic architecture of the Cathedral of Santa Maria and the Royal Palace of La Almudaina. Enjoy a leisurely lunch at one of Palma's charming cafes or restaurants, sampling local specialties such as paella, ensaimada, or seafood dishes. Spend the evening strolling along the Paseo Marítimo, Palma's waterfront promenade. Enjoy dinner at a waterfront restaurant, savoring fresh seafood while watching the sunset over the Mediterranean Sea.



Day 2 - Venture outside the capital for an epic day trip. Take a ride on the island's legendary wooden electrical train to Sóller. This is the perfect vantage point to admire the most beautiful landscapes in the Tramuntana mountain range, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Continue with a boat trip to La Calobra Cove. Stop for lunch, and enjoy some time at your leisure. You'll also visit the Torrent de Pareis, a narrow mouth of a torrent between two cliffs.



Day 3 - Rent a car from DiscoverCars.com and head to the eastern coast of Mallorca to explore the Cuevas del Drach (Caves of Drach) in Porto Cristo. Take a guided tour of the underground caves, including a boat ride on one of the underground lakes. Relax on the nearby beaches of *Cala Millor* or *Cala Ratjada*, where you can swim, sunbathe, and enjoy water sports such as snorkeling or paddleboarding. End your evening with a multi-course meal at *Terragust* under the stars.



Day 4 - Drive further south to first explore the gorgeous port of Cala Figuera. After a morning stroll, catch some rays on the beaches of Cala Llobards, Caló del Moro and/or S'Almonia. Depending on your departure time, enjoy a final meal at a local restaurant or cafe before heading to the airport.

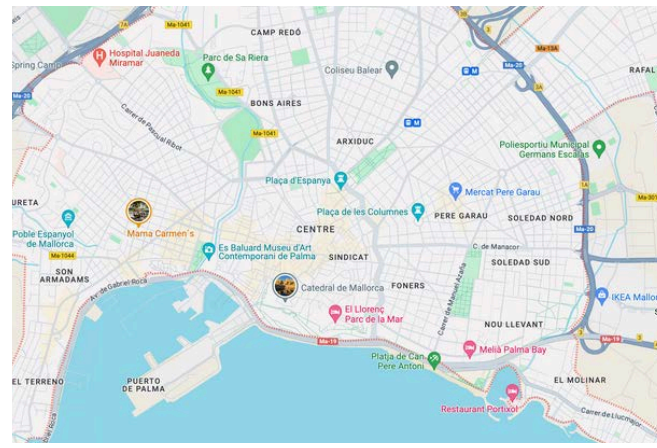

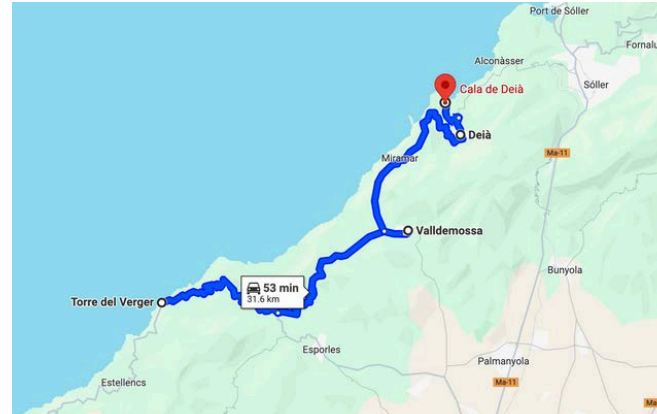

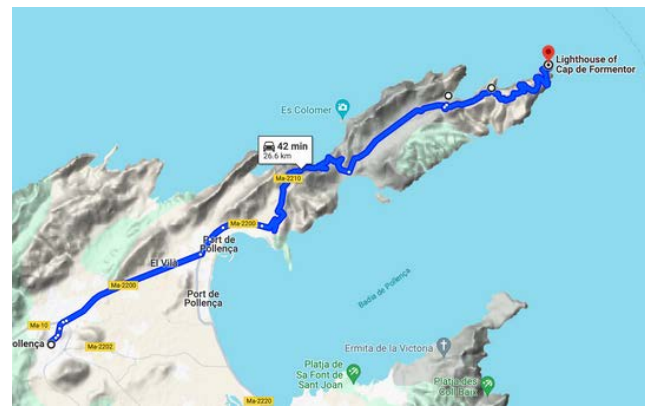
Day 2 - Venture outside the capital to start your epic Mallorca road trip. Rent a car from [DiscoverCars.com](https://www.discovercars.com) and head to West Mallorca. Enjoy a scenic drive through **Banyalbufar** to **Torre del Verger**. Stop for lunch at **QuitaPenas** in **Valldemossa** to enjoy their famous "Sobrasada". Continue your West coast trip to Port Deià before making your way to **Deià** for dinner. Don't forget to take a leisurely stroll after your meals around both towns for some amazing views! I'd recommend staying in Valldemossa for a couple of nights or one of my favorite boutique finca's on the West coast, **Rondaia!**



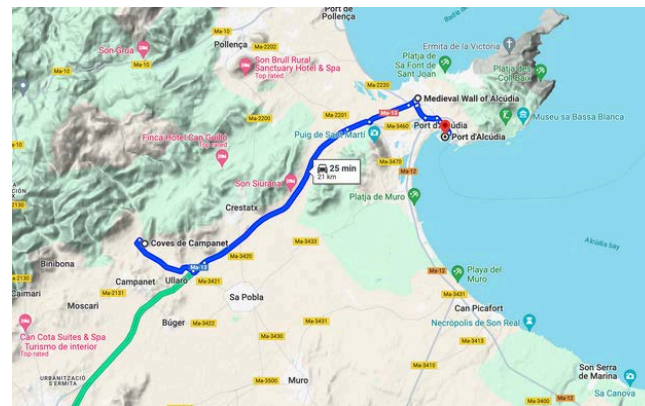
Day 3 - Today, start your day early (9am) in **Sóller**. If it's a weekend, you may run into a local market at **Plaça de la Constitució**, right next to **Iglesia de Sant Bartomeu de Sóller**. Once you've had time to take in a coffee, hop on the scenic tram ride to the last stop of **Port of Sóller**. The beach promenade is fruitful for people watching, but don't miss the *maritime museum* (it's free), not to mention the gorgeous views on the way up, looking back into the marina and city (see the bottom photo on page 23). If you're big into ships, boats and local fisherman like me, this is the place to be and one of my favorite towns in Mallorca. If you can, try to snag lunch reservations at "NENI Mallorca" a couple weeks in advance. Make sure to get the tram back and leave Sóller no later than 2:30pm, because this is where your road trip becomes "EPIC". From Sóller, head North on **MA-10** that passes **Gorg Blau**. Labeled as "snake road", this next hour of driving will be some of the best on the island as you make your way through forests and past side-bending cliffs with major drop offs. It's not for the faint of heart but perfectly safe and a lot of fun. Just watch the road and the cars in front of you at all times. End your journey at **Parking Sa Calobra**. After parking at the metered lot, follow the crowd down to swim at the **Port De Sa Calobra** or continue walking North, past **Biscuit Rock** and **Túnel Sa Calobra** to the **Sa Calobra gorge**. The gorge, with a huge sandbank in the middle is a great place to stay and relax between the cliffs to catch the last sunshine of the day or take a dip in the cove.



Day 4 - If yesterday was too long, consider taking today to recoup and relax at your hotel pool. But, if you're ready for more adventure, head North on *MA-13* to the town of **Pollença**. After a brief look around the charming town nestled between the Tramuntana mountains, stop and lunch. After your stomachs are full, explore the remote beach of **Cala Figuera**. On your way, consider stopping at the *Albercutx Watchtower* for beautiful views of the Northern coast of Mallorca. End your day admiring the sunset at the **Lighthouse of Cap de Formentor**.



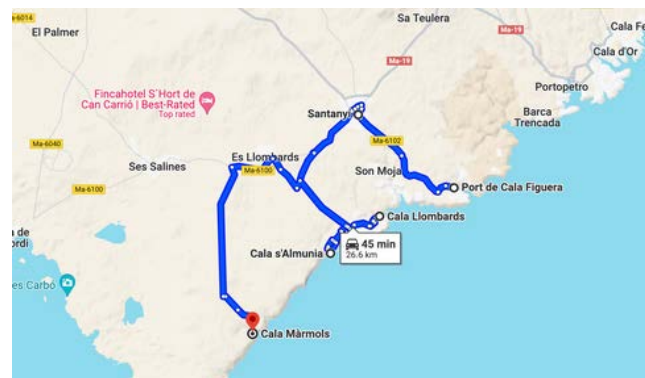
Day 5 - (Don't forget to pack your swimsuit and light layers for this evening's sail before you leave your accommodation). Make your way back North on *MA-13* to the **Coves de Campanet** at the foot of the Serra de Tramuntana mountain range. Then, head to "The Walled City", **Alcúdia**, for lunch. Enjoy your day wandering and getting lost in the maze of historic cobblestone streets. In the afternoon, navigate over to the **Port of Alcúdia**, where you will enjoy a traditional Mallorcan boat ride while enjoying fresh and tasteful bites to eat from the island. Day 6 - Finally, the beaches are calling today! Spend the morning in **Cala Agulla**, the farthest point East of Mallorca. If you need a break from the sun, make your way to **Cala Millor** for a seaside lunch and then another swim on its golden sand beach. This afternoon, you will be exploring another system of caves, **Caves of Drach** before enjoying the most delicious meal of your trip at **Terragust**, where you will dine in the middle of a vineyard, under the stars!



Day 7 - Start your day early and head on over to the **Port of Cala Figuera** in Southeastern Mallorca before it gets too hot. Enjoy the picturesque fishing village characterized by its quaint harbor dotted with colorful fishing boats and traditional Mediterranean architecture. Stroll along the waterfront promenade and admire the charm of this authentic Mallorcan gem. Afterwards, you can head to a number of amazing beaches and coves, including: **Cala S'Amarador**, **Cala Llombards**, **Calo del Moro**, **Cala s'Almunia** (Snorkeling & Cliff Jumping), **Cala Màrmols** or any other of the fine beaches in the area. The nearby town of **Santanyí** is famous for its weekly market, where locals and tourists alike can browse stalls selling fresh produce, local crafts, and souvenirs. A great place for lunch or dinner, depending on your flight out. Spend your last moments in Mallorca soaking up the sun and reminiscing about your week in the Balearic islands.
