CINQUE TERRE

The best time of year to travel?

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The optimal time to visit Cinque Terre is during the shoulder seasons of spring (April to May) and fall (September to October), when the weather is pleasant, the crowds are thinner, and the landscapes are vibrant. These months offer a delightful balance between favorable weather for hiking and a more tranquil atmosphere, enhancing the overall experience of this picturesque coastal destination.

Language: Italian

Currency: Euro (EUR)

Credit Cards & ATMs: Many Cinque Terre shops, restaurants, and hotels accept credit cards, but not all. Definitely carry a little bit of euros (€) on you.

Cell Service: If you don't have an international cell phone plan, pick up a SIM card at the airport or <u>purchase an eSIM here</u>.

Plugs: The plugs in Italy are type F, the standard voltage is 230 V, and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. I recommend buying a <u>universal adapter</u> and using a <u>voltage converter</u> for hairdryers and beard trimmers.

Food and Drinks: Pasta, Pizza, Gelato! Cinque Terre's cuisine embodies the coastal essence of Italy, featuring fresh seafood, Ligurian pesto, and regional delicacies. Local trattorias offer a taste of the Mediterranean, blending simplicity with rich flavors in dishes that celebrate the bounty of the sea and the region's culinary heritage.

The Arts: Cinque Terre's arts reflect coastal beauty, inspiring local creations in painting, crafts, and photography, capturing its unique charm.







CULTURE, CUSTOMS & SAFETY

As you wander through the picturesque villages, the sense of security is palpable – from the welcoming smiles of locals to the well-maintained pathways that lead to breathtaking viewpoints. However, those viewpoints require a lot of stairs. And, I mean, A TON OF STAIRS. Be prepared. Do not plan on bringing your full checked suitcase up them (pack light), it's very dangerous. Other than that, the tight-knit community and responsible tourism practices contribute to an environment where visitors can explore with ease.

While adventure awaits in every corner, Cinque Terre's safety ensures that your focus remains on the awe-inspiring vistas, delectable cuisine, and unforgettable experiences that define this coastal gem.

SETTING A BUDGET TO VALUE TRAVEL

Set a budget, even if it's a loose budget. An adventure in Italy doesn't have to be extremely expensive, it just takes a little bit of pre-planning. Your most expensive part of your trip will be airfare and accommodations. **Hint:** Travel in the shoulder season with pleasant weather and budget friendly prices.

When deciding on what village that you would like to stay in, keep your budget in mind. The accommodations with the best views are going to be more expensive, but they are worth every penny!

This is why I love value traveling.

What is **value traveling**? Value traveling is getting the most bang for your travel buck. When it comes to travel, meet somewhere in the middle, between budget and luxury. This will help stretch your budget throughout your vacation.

Set aside a few nights of your trip to overindulge on a luxury hotel stay in Riomaggiore at <u>Grand Hotel Central</u>.



Conversely, set aside the rest of the trip's accommodations for a more practical stay in another village perhaps.



It may cost you more, but you're paying for the experience. I wouldn't sacrifice on clean sheets and location, but you may want to sacrifice on amenities.

In the end, you will notice that you will get more value for your money by splitting your time between accommodations – luxury and budget.

If you like to move around, stay in one location for a minimum of two nights. This will give you the best experience in each area.

Excursions

What's a great trip to Cinque Terre without a <u>pesto making class</u>?! You don't need to book an excursion every day, that will help with your budget, but you could book a few throughout your stay. Don't be afraid to walk around for your own tour of the five towns, best visited by train or hiking.

Airfare

Save big on airfare by going to Cinque Terre in the shoulder seasons. April through late May and September through October. The weather will be pleasant at this time too, a perfect opportunity for a getaway!

To get an idea of how much your trip will cost, research prices for airfare, hotels, and activities before you make any non refundable purchases or reservations.

HOW TO SAVE MONEY IN CINQUE TERRE

Travel Points. The <u>Capital One Venture</u> <u>One</u> card is a fantastic travel rewards credit card with NO annual fee. However, you need good to excellent credit. If you're really serious about getting into travel reward points, consider using the <u>Capital</u> <u>One Venture</u> with a \$95 per year fee but a lot more perks.

Try Shoulder Season. Flights are often cheaper in the shoulder season or offseason. Check prices for different dates with <u>SkyScanner</u> in your travel window. A sale on airfare may help you afford a destination that's otherwise out of budget.

Avoid holidays, festivals, and other large events, unless that's the reason you're going to a specific destination. Crowds can inflate hotel rates, overwhelm popular sights, and make it difficult—and costly to get around.

Compare midweek to weekend flight and train prices. The Cinque Terre does not have an airport so you will be flying into Milan (MXP) or Florence (FLR) or Pisa (PSA). From each of those cities, you can take a train.

Once you've estimated your trip's flight and accommodation cost, start considering the cost of transportation.

Public transportation The train systems to and from Milan, Pisa, or Florence are very efficient. Cinque Terre has its own mini train system and it's very affordable.

A one-way train ticket with Cinque Terre Express trains costs £5 for adults and £2.50 for children between 4-11 years. If you want to visit more than two of the villages, I highly recommend you to purchase the <u>Cinque Terre Train Card</u> which costs £18.20 euros for a one-day card (adults) and includes unlimited train runs with the Cinque Terre Express trains on the La Spezia - Cinque Terre - Levanto line.

Next, get an idea of your food budget. I'm a foodie lover, so more likely than not, I'm finding new, fun, and interesting places to check out. Including this wonderful <u>Pesto</u> <u>Cooking Class</u>!



Hungry? You may find a really cheap and authentic meal off the main street of any of the five villages. Eating on the main street is usually expensive because of the convenience.

Bring a water bottle The tap water in Cinque Terre is fine to drink but buy a reusable water bottle to save money and reduce your plastic use. <u>LifeStraw</u> is my go-to brand as their bottles have built-in filters to ensure your water is always clean and safe. Note, restaurants will charge you for bottled water.

Travel Tip: Restaurant tipping- If you see "service included", it means that the tip has already been included. It is only a 10% tip so you can add more for great service.

The best part about Kayak is that you can track prices as they fluctuate to learn patterns and price drops. Track multiple flight options with just a click of a few buttons.


A question I get often is, "**when should I book?**". There's not a science to booking the right flight, at the right time. However, there are patterns to be aware of.

For example, flights in May-August will usually be higher, this is peak travel season. USA Holidays will also be higher.

Shoulder season is the best time to book (March, April & September, October). Your best bet is to book International travel around six months before traveling. This will typically give you the best price.

Monterosso al Mare is the only village in Cinque Terre with a sizable sandy beach, perfect for relaxing after a hike. Rent a sunbed and umbrella or take a refreshing dip in the turquoise waters. It's a great spot for families or those looking to unwind by the sea.

VISIT VERNAZZA'S HARBOR

Vernazza, often considered the most picturesque village, features a beautiful natural harbor lined with colorful houses. Climb to Doria Castle, a medieval fortress, for incredible views of the village and coastline. Afterwards, enjoy a meal at one of the many waterfront restaurants.

TOP 5 TRATTORIAS IN CINQUE TERRE

Trattorias in the region are small, family-run restaurants that focus on local, authentic cooking, offering a warm and welcoming atmosphere. Here are some of the best trattorias in Cinque Terre across its five villages:

1. Trattoria Dal Billy (Manarola)

One of the most popular trattorias in Cinque Terre, Dal Billy is known for its incredible seafood, friendly service, and panoramic views over Manarola and the Ligurian Sea. The seafood platter, featuring a wide variety of fresh local catches, is a highlight, as are the homemade pastas with seafood.

- *Specialties*: Mixed seafood platter, seafood pasta, grilled fish, and local white wine.
- *Reservations*: Recommended due to its popularity and stunning view.

2. Il Pirata delle Cinque Terre (Vernazza)

This trattoria is run by two Sicilian brothers who bring a unique blend of Ligurian and Sicilian cuisine to Vernazza. Known for its hearty breakfasts, pastries, and savory dishes, Il Pirata is a little off the beaten path but well worth a visit for its cozy ambiance and delicious, home-cooked meals.

- *Specialties*: Cannoli, seafood pasta, bruschetta, and swordfish.

- Reservations: Recommended, especially for dinner.

3. Trattoria Il Porticciolo (Manarola)

A cozy trattoria in the heart of Manarola, II Porticciolo is known for its friendly atmosphere and traditional Ligurian fare. It offers a wide variety of seafood dishes as well as local specialties like trofie al pesto and farinata (a chickpea pancake typical of the region).

- *Specialties*: Trofie al pesto, fried seafood, and seafood pasta.

- Reservations: Recommended during busy times.

4. Ristorante Miky (Monterosso al Mare)

Though slightly more refined than a typical trattoria, Miky is famous for its fresh, locally sourced seafood and traditional dishes with a modern twist. It's located near Monterosso's beach and offers a great selection of wines to pair with its high-quality meals.

- Specialties: Seafood risotto, baked anchovies, and squid ink pasta.

- *Reservations*: Recommended, as it's very popular with locals and tourists alike.

5. Trattoria Cecio (Corniglia)

Trattoria Cecio is a small family-run restaurant located in the heart of Corniglia, offering a menu that highlights local flavors and fresh ingredients from both land and sea. The terrace provides a great view of the surrounding hills and sea, and the food is consistently praised for its quality and authenticity.

- *Specialties*: Tagliatelle with pesto, seafood risotto, and fried calamari.
- Reservations: Recommended due to its small size.

TOP 5 ROOFTOPS BARS IN CINQUE TERRE

1. Nessun Dorma (Manarola)

Perched on a hill overlooking Manarola's iconic colorful buildings and the sea (pictured below), Nessun Dorma is one of the most famous spots in Cinque Terre. It's not exactly a rooftop, but its elevated, open-air terrace offers stunning views, making it feel like a rooftop experience. The bar serves light bites like bruschetta, salads, and charcuterie boards, as well as excellent cocktails and local wines. The views of Manarola at sunset are unbeatable. Specialties^{*} include Aperol spritz, bruschetta with fresh pesto, and local wine. This place can get crowded, so it's best to arrive early or be prepared for a short wait.

2. La Torre (Vernazza)

Located just above Vernazza, La Torre offers sweeping views of the sea and the village's harbor. The terrace is perfect for a relaxed meal or drink with an incredible backdrop. This spot is known for its seafood dishes, homemade pasta, and local wine. The elevated position gives you a perfect vantage point to take in the beauty of Vernazza from above. It's slightly off the beaten path, so it's quieter than other spots in Vernazza.

3. Ristorante Miky (Monterosso al Mare)

While Miky is more of a restaurant than a bar, it has an outdoor terrace that offers a lovely setting for a drink or meal with a sea view. Located in the newer part of Monterosso, close to the beach, this upscale spot is known for its high-quality food and great wine list. The outdoor terrace, especially during dinner hours, offers beautiful views of the sunset over the Ligurian Sea. This is a more refined, sit-down dining experience, perfect for a special evening.

4. Bar Terza Terra (Corniglia)

Corniglia is the quietest of the five villages, but Bar Terza Terra offers stunning views from its cliffside terrace. The terrace overlooks the sea and the surrounding coastline, making it an ideal spot to relax with a coffee or glass of wine after hiking. The peaceful ambiance, combined with breathtaking views, makes this one of the hidden gems of Cinque Terre.

5. A Pie de Ma (Riomaggiore)

This bar sits on a terrace just above the train station in Riomaggiore, with direct views over the sea and the cliffs. A Pie de Ma is a great place to stop for an aperitivo, with a laid-back atmosphere and excellent wine selection. The sea views and the sound of the waves make it one of the most relaxing places for a drink in Riomaggiore during sunset.



PLAN YOUR ACCOMODATION

Once your flight is booked, it's best to start locking in accommodations. The earlier you find one you love, the better. Just know that great accommodations can book up more than six months in advance.

Determine if your Italian adventure is going to be in a centralized location, such as Vernazza or Corniglia, or if you would like to stay in a couple of different villages during your stay.

The five villages of the Cinque Terre can be hiked, if you so wish. Otherwise, the train system is a little less enduring for a few euros each way.

Each village is unique in its own right but you really cannot go wrong with any of them! In each village you will find narrow alleys, cobblestone streets, pasta, gelato, beautiful views and extraordinary charm.

Take your time to pick the one that meets your needs by reading about the different Cinque Terre villages in the next few pages.



Visit my website for a custom <u>Cinque</u> <u>Terre Hotel Finder</u> to choose the best *hotel, apartment* or *VRBO*. Make a final decision in order of location, price, style, features and amenities, *in that order*. Before making any kind of payment, make sure you know the cancellation policy. And if you think you need it, purchase trip cancellation insurance. Most major travel credit cards include trip protection, such as the <u>Capital One Venture</u> card or the <u>Chase Sapphire Preferred</u> card.



Another reason to book using your <u>Capital</u> <u>One Venture</u> or <u>Chase Sapphire Preferred</u> card is collecting miles and points for future traveling. **That's right, more benefits for you!** Every time I travel, I'm already checking my new mileage chart for my next destination.

So, use those travel reward credit cards to get a jump start on your future travels. You may even get a round trip to Hawaii (or similar) for free by just using your sign-up bonus miles. I did!

Generally, their prices don't swing and there will be no deals to be had. Expect to pay for what you get at these luxury and off the beaten path stays.

THE FIVE VILLAGES OF CINQUE TERRE

The five villages of Cinque Terre, Italy—Monterosso al Mare, Vernazza, Corniglia, Manarola, and Riomaggiore—are perched along the dramatic Ligurian coastline, each offering its own unique charm.

Together, they form a UNESCO World Heritage site (since 1997) renowned for their breathtaking scenery, colorful buildings, and rich cultural history.

Each village in Cinque Terre has its own personality, but all share the region's breathtaking beauty, delicious Ligurian cuisine, and warm, welcoming atmosphere.

Did you know?

Cinque Terre is designated as a national park.

Officially known as the Parco Nazionale delle Cinque Terre (Cinque Terre National Park), it was established in 1999 to preserve the unique cultural and natural landscapes of the five picturesque villages.

Whether hiking the trails, enjoying the sea views, or wandering through the charming streets, Cinque Terre offers a truly magical experience.

Monterosso al Mare is the largest of the five villages that make up the famed Cinque Terre region on the Ligurian coast of Italy.

Monterosso offers dramatic coastal views, with turquoise waters, rocky cliffs, and sandy beaches, making it the best spot for sunbathing in Cinque Terre. The hills surrounding the village are covered in olive groves, lemon trees, and vineyards, creating a picturesque setting.

Unlike the other Cinque Terre villages, Monterosso has large, sandy beaches—rare in this region. The main beach is ideal for swimming and relaxing, and it's lined with cafes, bars, and restaurants.

The village is divided into two parts: the old town (*Borgo Antico*) and the newer *Fegina district*. Borgo Antico boasts narrow lanes, colorful houses, and significant historical sites like the *Church of San Giovanni Battista*, the *Capuchin Monastery*, and the *Medieval Tower of Aurora*.

Monterosso is famous for its anchovies, considered a delicacy in the region. Pair them with local wines like *Sciacchetrà*, a sweet wine from Cinque Terre, or enjoy fresh seafood pasta dishes and traditional focaccia.

Of the five villages, Monterosso has a more relaxed, resort-like vibe. It's perfect for those wanting a laid-back experience while still being able to explore the rugged beauty of Cinque Terre.

Corniglia is the smallest and perhaps the most unique of the five Cinque Terre villages, perched high on a cliff about 100 meters above sea level. It's a climb to get to the top, but well worth it! Unlike the other villages, it doesn't have direct access to the sea, which gives it a more secluded and peaceful atmosphere.

The sweeping views from the village over the Ligurian Sea and the surrounding vineyards are truly breathtaking. From certain vantage points, you can even see all five Cinque Terre villages.

Corniglia doesn't have a harbor, so it's often quieter and less crowded than the other villages. It retains a more authentic, local feel, with a slower pace of life. The village's narrow alleys, cozy cafes, and charming small squares offer an intimate experience of rural Italian life.

Corniglia has a rich history, and its medieval origins can still be seen in its architecture. Highlights include the **Church of San Pietro**, a beautiful Gothic-Ligurian church built in the 14th century. Wandering the ancient streets of the village feels like stepping back in time.

CINQUE TERRE TRANSPORTATION

Cinque Terre offers several transportation options to help visitors explore the five villages—Monterosso al Mare, Vernazza, Corniglia, Manarola, and Riomaggiore each with its unique charm.

1. Train (The Cinque Terre Express)

The most convenient and popular way to travel between the villages is by train. The Cinque Terre Express runs frequently, connecting all five villages along the scenic coastline. The train line is fast, with only a few minutes between stops, making it the easiest way to move between villages if you're short on time or want to avoid long hikes. Trains also connect Cinque Terre to nearby cities like La Spezia, Pisa, and Genoa.

• Ticket: A Cinque Terre Train Card allows unlimited train travel for one or more days, including access to hiking trails.

• Stations: All villages have their own train station, except Corniglia, which requires a climb of 382 steps (or a shuttle bus) to reach the village from the station.

2. Boat (Ferry Service)

A ferry service operates between the villages (except Corniglia, which does not have a harbor), offering a scenic and relaxing way to travel along the coast. This option provides stunning views of the colorful cliffside villages from the water, and it's particularly enjoyable during the warmer months. The ferries also connect to **Portovenere**, a nearby coastal town worth exploring. • Ticket: One-way and day-pass tickets are available, allowing you to hop on and off between the villages.

• Schedule: Ferries typically run from spring to early fall, with more frequent services in the summer.

3. Hiking

Hiking is one of the most rewarding ways to explore Cinque Terre. The Sentiero Azzurro (Blue Trail) connects all five villages, with paths offering breathtaking views of the Mediterranean and the terraced vineyards. Some trails, like the Via dell'Amore between Riomaggiore and Manarola, are relatively easy, while others can be more challenging with steep inclines.

• Ticket: A Cinque Terre Trekking Card is required to access the trails and can be purchased at the start of the trails or online.

• Note: Some sections of the trail may be closed due to maintenance or weather conditions, so it's important to check ahead.

4. Shuttle Bus

There is a shuttle bus service that connects the villages with their surrounding areas, especially useful for reaching more remote spots or higher points in the villages like Volastra or Corniglia (from the train station). These buses are part of the national park's transportation system and are a good alternative if you prefer not to hike.

How to use the Card

The Card bears the user's full name and may not be used by others. Before using a card, the user's name, and surname (or the head of the family's name in case of family cards) must be written on the back. Cards must be shown to inspectors together with a valid identity document.

Children under 4 travel on the trains and use the Park services for free if accompanied by an adult in possession of a Card.

GATHER DOCUMENTATION

At least six months before your departure, make sure your ID, passport and other necessary documents are in order.

Driver's license: Most of the time, you can leave this at home. However, <u>if you are renting a car</u>, you will need to show it to your agency. Also, if you lose your passport, this is a good second form of identification.

Passport: Applying for or renewing a passport typically takes six to eight weeks, but now <u>eligible US citizens</u> can renew online. However, you can pay an additional \$60 expedited service fee to get it renewed in two to three weeks, if desired. If you plan to travel outside the U.S., you need a passport. <u>Make sure your passport</u> will not expire for at least six months after your trip is scheduled to end. Some countries also require passports to have one to two blank pages for entry.

Visas: If you're traveling to another country, you may need to apply for a tourist visa. This could require paying a visit, or sending your passport, to a foreign embassy or consulate in the U.S. Application fees typically run from \$50 to \$200. Visit the U.S. Bureau of Consular Affairs to learn more. **TSA PreCheck and Global Entry:** A travel reward credit card like the <u>Capital One card</u>, gives you up to a \$85 credit towards these programs.

Confused about the two programs? Here's the difference: **TSA Precheck** (\$85) puts you in a faster security line at U.S. airports.

Global Entry (\$100) includes TSA Precheck and adds expedited customs screening upon your return from international trips. These programs can help you zip through airport security lines.

Before you apply, give yourself a few weeks to fill out the online application and visit an enrollment center for fingerprinting and an ID check.

You must already have a valid U.S. passport to apply for Global Entry, and you must participate in an interview at a designated enrollment center. Once approved, your status lasts five years. Most interviews last about five minutes, it's very easy!


